Governor's FY 18 Budget Vetoes

On July 17, Governor Baker signed the FY18 Conference Committee Budget into law and vetoed \$320 million in spending. He also sent back for amendment, as part of a larger package of MassHealth changes, the sections of the budget that would have allowed the Commonwealth to levy new fees and fines on employers to help pay for increased MassHealth costs.

Governor Baker noted the employer tax should only be implemented if the MassHealth reforms he proposed in late June were included as part of the package. The Governor called on the Legislature to hold full hearings on the MassHealth proposals and act within 60 days. It is unclear at this point whether the Legislature plans to act.

Governor Baker vetoed \$4 million in spending from the *Chapter 257* rate reserve line item. The administration noted this funding was included in a supplemental budget that passed earlier this year and is no longer needed in FY18. The administration has assured the provider community that if additional funding is needed in FY18 the administration will pursue this funding through the supplemental budget process.

The vetoes were returned to the Legislature recently. The Legislature now has the opportunity to override each veto. A two thirds vote of each branch is required to override a gubernatorial veto. Marijuana Legislation: Compromise Reached

House and Senate members of the Marijuana Conference Committee reached an agreement on the state's marijuana legislation on July 18. Following this agreement, the House and Senate passed with bill and sent it to Governor Baker's desk. Governor Baker signed the bill into law on Friday, July 28.

Unfortunately, the bill does not include a specific funding amount dedicated to addiction prevention and treatment services. The Conference Committee does raise the maximum tax rate to 20%. This funding would be dedicated to the "Marijuana Regulation Fund." It does include the requirement that funding be spent on public and behavioral health among other uses.

Rate Hearings

The Executive Office of Health and Human Services (EOHHS) recently posted a notice of public hearing for Rates for Clubhouse Services (101 CMR 416) and Rates for Supported Employment Services (101 CMR 419) on Friday, August 4. The rates for Clubhouse and Supported Employment Services are being updated to include an increase by a cost adjustment factor (CAF) of 2.72%. Prescription for Transportation Forms

Currently, providers are able to submit paper Prescription for Transportation (PT-I) forms in order to request authorization for transportation to an appointment on behalf of the client. Providers must use this <u>form</u> to do so.

In 2018, MassHealth will transition to a paperless PT-1 submission. Providers should request access to the MassHealth Customer Service Web Portal now in order to "ensure compliance, to expedite submission of your PT-1 request, and to avoid rejection of an unauthorized PT-1 form.: To do so, request a User ID <u>here</u>.
