#### Fund Clinics Fairly Bill: The Road So Far

As ABH members know too well, thousands of vulnerable children, families and adults continue to wait months to access basic mental health treatment services. Reimbursement rates for mental health clinics fall far short to ensure access to help and to recruit and retain the clinicians needed to meet current needs. ABH filed S. 760/ H. 2006 to provide additional funding for mental health clinics.

In October, ABH held a State House Day and email campaign in support of the bill on the same day that the Legislature's Joint Committee on Health Care Financing held a hearing on our bill. A recording of the hearing is available <u>here</u>. The portion relating to our bill begins at 7:19. Thank you to our members who testified, to those who participated in our State House Day, and to those who emailed their legislators on the importance of funding clinics fairly.

#### Action Alert: We Need Your Help

The October hearing was on the Senate version of our bill (S. 760). On Monday, December 4, the Legislature's Joint Committee on Mental Health and Substance Abuse is held a hearing on the House version of our legislation (H. 2006) to increase mental health clinic funding. Since our Day on the Hill, our campaign has sent more than 1,2000 emails into the State House pushing for legislation to increase reimbursement rates to mental health clinics!!! ## ABH 2023 Salary Survey Report

The Association for Behavioral Healthcare (ABH), in partnership with Gallagher Surveys, developed a salary and benefits survey that focused specifically on mental health and substance use disorder providers. The final product included extensive input and guidance from the ABH Human Resources Committee, the ABH Human Resources Salary Survey Subcommittee, and the ABH Senior Leadership Committee on Diversity, Equity, Inclusion & Justice. Thank you to the committee members who worked to develop and refine the survey and to the staff who developed and reported data that made this survey possible.

## The results are now in and available for purchase. We anticipate that these results will be a great resource for members.

#### Survey Cost

As with past surveys, a significant discount will be given to ABH members who participated in the salary survey. The cost to purchase the survey is as follows:

## 2024 Massachusetts Loan Repayment Program (MLRP)

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (DPH) Health Care Workforce Center has announced the next round of applications for the Massachusetts Loan Repayment Program for Health Professionals (MLRP), a loan repayment program managed by the Massachusetts League of Community Health Centers (MLCHC). MLRP is for health care professionals who commit to working full time or part time for two years in an eligible organization (up to \$25,000 per year for two years). This program is funded through a combination of state and federal funds. The application for the Massachusetts State Loan Repayment Program (MLRP) is now open, as of December 6, 2023.

These regulations apply to applies to MA-based, fully-insured health insurance plans regulated by DOI. They do NOT apply to MassHealth or Medicare.
