NEW DSRIP FUNDING NOW AVAILABLE Health Center & Behavioral Health Leaders

The Association for Behavioral Healthcare (ABH) is pleased to share the following information from the Massachusetts League of Community Health Centers:

The Massachusetts League of Community Health Centers (MassLeague) is pleased to announce the launch of the third year of the **Student Loan Repayment Program** (SLRP) & Primary Care/Behavioral Health Special Projects Program (Special Projects Program). SLRP offers partial repayment of student loan obligations for primary care and behavioral health clinicians who commit to four years of practice in an eligible community-based setting. The Special Projects Program aims to engage and retain primary care and behavioral health providers in community settings across Massachusetts and supports innovative on-the-ground projects that advance the ability of community-based provider organizations to succeed in an accountable care environment. Funding for these programs comes through the Massachusetts League's contract with the Executive Of-fice of Health and Human Services (EOHHS) to develop and implement seven community-based primary care and behavioral health workforce initiatives as part of MassHealth's \$1.8 billion Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment (DSRIP) Program. The MassLeague works closely with ABH to administer the behavioral health components of these programs.

Additional workforce initiatives will be launched in the coming months, the details of which will be disseminated by MassHealth and the MassLeague as they become available.

Public Charge Rule

As you know, the Trump Administration is implementing important changes regarding immigrants' use of public benefits. This is known as the "public charge" rule.

What is "public charge"? Effective February 24, 2020, the federal government will use an expanded "public charge" test to determine who may be denied a visa or adjustment of status to lawful permanent residence (a "green card"). The policy changes could penalize immigrants for using some public benefits (government programs that may help pay for food, housing or health care) and would make it more difficult for a family with a low or moderate income to obtain a green card.

The enacted changes allow more types of public benefits to be considered when making public charge determinations, including certain MassHealth benefits. While these rule changes do not directly impact community-based behavioral health provider organizations, they may discourage some immigrants from accessing public benefits, including MassHealth benefits.

The impact of the public charge on immigration status is complicated. For more information about what benefits may or may not be taken into account in a public charge determination, visit Health Care for All's <u>web-</u> <u>site</u> or read their guidance <u>here</u>.

Free Home Base Workshops

Home Base works to heal the invisible wounds of war for Service Members, Veterans and their Families through clinical care, wellness, research and education. The purpose of this training initiative is to give health professionals tools to identify, support and refer veterans and their families to community resources and Home Base trained evidence based therapy providers in their communities.

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Register Now! Adaptive Leadership Training

The Association for Behavioral Healthcare (ABH), in partnership with the Massachusetts League of Community Health Centers, has a grant from the Delta Center for a Thriving Safety Net to increase capacity around value-based purchasing and care. The Delta Center has promoted Adaptive Leadership (AL) as a framework for organizations preparing for complex change. The AL framework, developed by management researchers at Harvard University, is taught throughout the US and across the globe.

Adaptive Leadership is a practical leadership framework that helps individuals and organizations adapt and thrive in challenging environments. It focuses on developing both on the individual and collective level the ability to take on the gradual but meaningful process of change. Adaptive Leadership is purposeful evolution in real time.

We are pleased to be able to bring a half-day introduction to AL to the membership of ABH and the League. The training will be led by Kimberlyn Leary, PhD of the Harvard School of Public Health. Dr. Leary is a psychologist, with experience in community-based clinics, and many years of experience as a trainer and teacher. This session will include a didactic presentation as well as small group work on a specific case presentation.
